



CGC seeks nominations for its annual *National Master Guardian Star Achievement Award*, which will be presented at the National Guardianship Association's Annual Conference.

Receiving the CGC's National Master Guardian certification demonstrates the guardian's knowledge of advanced guardianship concepts and ethics and being on the cutting edge of guardianship issues.

The CGC National Master Guardian Star Achievement Award Committee will review all nominations that include the following nominating criteria:

Nominating Criteria

- 1. All current NCGs, NMGs, and members of the National Guardianship Association (NGA) are eligible to nominate a Master Guardian for the NMG Star Award.
- 2. Nominees must meet the following criteria:
 - a. The nominee must be a National Master Guardian.
 - b. The nominee must be a member of NGA.
 - c. The nominee should have some affiliation with his/her state association.
- 3. Nominations must include the following information:
 - a. The nominee's and nominator's name, organization/firm, address, telephone number and email address. The nominator must also include whether he or she is an NGA member or CGC certified guardian.
 - b. Specific examples demonstrating the nominee's leadership within the guardianship community. (Weighted at 40%)
 - c. Specific examples on how the nominee exemplifies the NGA Standards of Practice and Ethical Principles. (*Weighted at 40%*)
 - d. A description of how the nominee contributes to the larger community. (Weighted at 20%)
- 4. Nominations will be accepted and reviewed annually; however, the committee reserves the right to not present this award in any one year.

Nominations must be received NO LATER THAN August 19, 2024.
